

Annex 2: Representing Risk and Trajectory.

For each of the factors, the overall assessment can be shown through a coloured arrow system, where the colour shows the current risk level (high, medium/high, medium, low/medium, low (Table 1: Current Risk Level)), while the direction of the arrow shows the projected trajectory (static risk, declining risk, increasing risk (Table 2: Projected Trajectory)). Table 3 (Risk Level and Trajectory Combined (Illustrative Examples)), provides a number of illustrative examples showing how both risk level and trajectory can be combined. Finally, Table 4, Summary of Factors, illustrates how these arrows can be used to summarise the results for the seven factors identified in Annex 1.





