Baby veins are difficult to find when drawing blood

Difficulties for Medical Professionals

Finding baby veins

• More subcutaneous **fat**

Keeping baby still and calm

- **Movements** make needle placement harder
- Stress causes **vessels to constrict**



Baby veins are difficult to find when drawing blood

Difficulties for baby

- Multiple punctures in different directions -> ruptured tissue and pain
- Distress from **multiple attempts**
- Fear of strangers in hospital setting
- Trouble falling asleep

Difficulties for caretaker

• General **frustration** and **distress** with failed attempts



Medical professionals draw blood from baby arm

Easily locate veins to avoid repeated punctures

Protect user from needle injury

Hold patient still in an appropriate position
