



Graph depicts minority-white turnout gaps in congressional and presidential elections since 2006. "Gap" is the difference between minority group turnout rate and white turnout rate. Turnout rate is a ratio of actual voters and estimates of citizen voting agepopulation for a given racial/ethnic group.
