TUSDM Alums and Residents Making a Difference in Maine

Dean Karimbux traveled to Maine recently to meet with alums who are practicing, and residents who are learning, in that state. The Dean was proud to see how these current and future dentists are playing active, positive roles in local communities.

Since 2014, TUSDM has offered the <u>Advanced Education in</u> <u>General Dentistry (AEGD)</u> program. Under the leadership of Program Director and Assistant Dean for Postgraduate Clinics, **Dr. Gina Terenzi**, the AEGD program is designed to expose residents to a variety of experiences in the classroom and in the clinic while addressing the dental needs of the underserved.

The AEGD program is a 12-month residency that accepts eight participants each year; four are assigned to Boston, and four to Maine. The residencies in Maine are conducted in partnership with <u>Maine</u> <u>Medical Center</u> and <u>Com-</u> <u>munity Dental</u>. Clinical instruction is provided at Community Dental offices in Portland, Biddeford, and

Lewiston. Clinical rotations are held at Community Dental offices in Farmington and Rumford. Throughout the program, residents learn how to perform a wide range of services, from general dentistry to advanced procedures in specialties such as endodontics, periodontology, and oral surgery.

Community Dental is a non-profit dental organization serving more than 16,000 patients each year in southern, central, and western Maine. They provide oral healthcare that is not only affordable and accessible but comprehensive and first-rate. A number of their providers are TUSDM alums, including **Dr. Genko Stanilov**, D11, and **Dr. Meghann Dombroski**, D10, DG14. "Community Dental is the reason I dedicate myself to dentistry, meeting and helping people from so many different cultures and social backgrounds. I am glad that I can contribute," said Dr. Stanilov.

In addition to her own practice, Dr. Dombroski also provides orthodontic care at Community Dental once a week. She is one of the few orthodontists in Maine who serves vulnerable populations due to her commitment to public health (she earned her Master of Public Health from Harvard in 2012).

Dean Karimbux announced that Professor and Director of Advanced Education in Esthetic Dentistry, **Dr. Aikaterini Papathanasiou**, has been appointed Interim Chair of Comprehensive Care, effective Sept. 1. The Dean said he is looking forward to having her as a part of his leadership team.

Dr. Papathanasiou is cur-

rently a full-time faculty member in the Department of Prosthodontics. She earned her DDS from the University of Athens (Greece) School of Dentistry in 1995. She did her postdoctoral studies at the Aarhus University School of Dentistry in Denmark, where she earned a certificate in operative dentistry, and at TUSDM, where she earned a certificate in esthetic dentistry. Since 2007, she has been a visiting lecturer at the New York University College of Dentistry in their continuing-education program.

In addition to teaching, Dr. Papathanasiou has published articles in peer-reviewed journals, served as editor-in-chief of the Greek dental journal *Esthetic Dentistry and Implantology*, is a member of the editorial team of Reality Esthetics (a division of the Reality Publishing Company), and is on the editorial review board of the Journal of Cosmetic Dentistry.

Dr. Papathanasiou is a <u>Fellow of the International College of</u> <u>Dentists (ICD)</u> and the <u>International Academy for Dental and</u> <u>Facial Esthetics (IADFE)</u>. She is also a member of the university relations committee at the <u>American Academy of Cosmetic</u> <u>Dentistry</u>.

For many years, Dr. Papathanasiou ran a private practice in Athens specializing in esthetic and restorative dentistry. She currently practices part time in Brookline and Boston.



Congrats to the Recipients of the Dean's Research Honors Scholarship

This year's recipients of the Dean's Research Honors Scholarship were announced recently, and they included **Yenna Chu**, **Alexander Nemeth, Susan Procopio, Maha Shafiq, Salma Shaker, Michael Song**, and **Komal Wasif**.

The Dean's Research Honors Scholarship is prestigious and highly competitive. It provides opportunity and support to incoming students with superior academic records and an interest in conducting research in the fields of basic science, clinical research, and public health. The scholarship also encourages recipients to conduct interdisciplinary research via collaborations with the Schools of Engineering and Medicine.

Recipients are paired with a faculty mentor in the fall semester, during which they meet regularly for one-on-one discussions about assigned readings. During the spring semester, the faculty mentor guides the student through the development of their research proposal. The student then conducts their research during the summer, prepares their presentation in the fall, and gives their presentation during the following spring's Bates-Andrews Student Research Day. The scholarship includes a \$3,000 merit award credited to recipients' second semester student account. Participation in this program is noted on students' transcripts. Students who successfully complete the program in their first year may reapply for their second, third, and fourth years.

Assistant Professor and Clinical Program Director for Geriatric Dentistry, **Dr. Karin Arsenault**, announced that her project, *Walking in Their Shoes: Using Simulation to Promote Understanding of the Challenges Faced by Individuals with Disabilities, Including Older Adults*, had been selected to receive funding from <u>Tufts Springboard</u>.

As indicated by its title, Dr. Arsenault's project will use disability simulations, i.e., exercises during which participants without disabilities attempt to experience the barriers people with disabilities may encounter. Dr. Arsenault and her team will examine how these exercises affect participants' perceptions of, and attitudes toward, people with disabilities. Her goal is to have participants identify and consider how to undo healthcare inequities patients with disabilities face. •

TUSDM Alum Is Named One of the Most Influential People in Dentistry

Dr. Abe Abdul, Do2, creator of <u>Dental Cupid</u>, was named by Incisal Edge Magazine as one of the <u>32 Most Influ-</u> <u>ential People in Dentistry</u>. Dr. Abdul founded Dental Cupid during the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic to address the imbalances in access to dental care. Initially, the platform was designed to connect patients in need with dentists who

Dr. Tonelli was the spokesperson for the Massachusetts Dental Care Providers for Better Dental Benefits committee at the MDS. The committee was created by the MDS in partnership with the <u>American Dental Association (ADA)</u> during the 2022 election cycle to encourage the Massachusetts electorate to vote "yes" on Question 2: Should Massachusetts regulate dental insurance rates? Dr. Tonelli's expertise on this issue was a key factor in generating support for this first-in-the-nation reform of dental insurance from voters and established a path for other states to follow. •
