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Tufts Springboard - Fall/Winter 2021

It is our pleasure to announce the 4th cycle of [Tufts Springboard](#), with applications for Research & Scholarship program due on Friday, October 29th 2021 and Educational/Curricular program due on Tuesday, January 18, 2022.

Special consideration will be given to research, scholarship, and educational projects that focus on racial inequities and/or promoting anti-racist interventions in keeping with the University's commitment to be an anti-racist institution.

Co-sponsored by the Office of the Provost and the Office of the Vice Provost for Research (OVPR), the goal of Tufts Springboard is to stimulate high impact research, scholarship and educational initiatives that have an explicit plan leading to extramural funding or other outcomes that influence research, scholarship, educational outcomes, and/or policy. Moreover, the Tufts Springboard program aims to further the priorities of the University and its schools and to fortify Tufts' status as a [R1, very-high research activity university](#).

The Tufts Springboard program is designed to be responsive to the needs created by the constantly changing world and funding landscape in several distinct ways. Applications for Research & Scholarship program will be reviewed two times each year—in Fall and Spring. Applications for Educational/Curricular program will be reviewed once each year in Winter.

Projects should be built on the applicant's prior work and lead to a long-term research, scholarship, or curricular endeavor. The program is not intended for one-off projects, but rather to make a lasting contribution to Tufts mission via research, scholarship, or education. The emphasis is on outcomes that draw vital support and recognition to Tufts as a leading contributor to the world around us through research, scholarship, and educational outcomes.

There are three funding tiers*.

Tier 1 (awards up to \$100K) is meant to advance large collaborative efforts, build critical mass, and position Tufts to have the highest possible impact and must lead to an extramural proposal of over \$1M/yr (direct cost) for up to 2yrs within 12 months of completion.

Tier 2 (awards up to \$35K) supports ambitious research projects that will build collaborative teams with the goal to amplify long-term research, scholarship, and educational endeavors. Extramural applications are strongly encouraged and a detailed continuation plan is required.

Tier 3 (awards up to \$15K) can be used for a variety of research, scholarship, and educational innovation. Extramural applications are strongly encouraged and a detailed continuation plan is required.

Tufts Springboard reflects a desire to create a thriving ecosystem to advance research, scholarship, and educational innovation at multiple stages of magnitude, propelling Tufts to continuing success in this new decade.

Outstanding Contributions to Dental Research Winners

Every year TUSDM selects a student or students to win the Award for Outstanding Contributions to Dental Research by a Post-Doctoral Student. Unlike the awards offered to students at Interdepartmental Research Day, this award is not based solely on the quality of a single research project that the student conducted. Instead, it is based on the student's overall contribution to research while at TUSDM. Faculty make nominations, and a committee selects the winner(s). This year's Award for Outstanding Contributions to Dental Research by a Post-Doctoral Student are **Dr. Lin-Hsin Chuang** (Assistant Professor in Periodontology) and **Dr. Po Lee** (MS and PG certificate student in Periodontology). Both students have made outstanding contributions to the research at the dental school. Terrific work, Dr. Chuang and Dr. Lee!

Service with a Smile



TUSDM's Service With a Smile Program is proud to announce that it has received a grant from the Disabled Veterans National Foundation (DVNF) for \$20,000! The award from DVNF is the largest funding the program has received to date.

The funds will be used to support the complete dental treatment for approximately 15 veterans screened at the New England Center and Home for Veterans (NECHV). In addition, Service With a Smile is hoping to utilize funds to expand its program and partner with other Veteran Resource Centers in the Greater Boston area.

Service With A Smile was founded in 2019 by two Iraq War combat veterans and students at TUSDM, **Dr. Brent Mullen (D20)** and **Dr. Keith Nguyen (D20)**, who are now serving in the Army as dentists. They had a vision to give back to their veteran comrades and to honor their friends whom they served with who made the ultimate sacrifice for the love of their country.

Service With A Smile aims to: 1) Increase access to oral health care for veterans experiencing homelessness or living in Veterans homes that are not eligible for services elsewhere; 2) Increase awareness of oral health needs of veterans among TUSDM faculty and students; 3) Pair third and fourth year student dental clinician providers at TUSDM with veterans who are in need of dental care; and 4) Give first and second year dental students the experience of providing oral health education in community settings.

The project is led by **Professor Kathryn Dolan** (RDH, Med), Director of the Tufts Community Oral Health Outreach program within the Department of Public Health and Community Service and **Dr. Gerard Kugel** DMD, MS, PhD, Associate Dean for Research and Professor, Department of Comprehensive Care. Service With A Smile's goal is to connect each veteran, especially those experiencing homelessness, to a dental home for comprehensive oral health care.

DVNF provides critically needed support to disabled and at-risk veterans by offering direct financial support, providing online resources, and serving as a leader on veteran's policy issues. More information can be found at <https://www.dvnf.org/>.



IADR 2021—Virtual Conference Recap

The International Association of Dental Research (IADR) General Session & Exhibition was held virtually in July 2021. Tufts was well represented at the meeting, by having 22 student presenters and 4 faculty members present their research either by poster or oral presentation.

Tufts was the recipient of several awards at the IADR conference. Each U.S. dental school is given the opportunity to select one student for participation in the Student Competition for Advancing Dental Research and its Application (SCADA), and **Grace Call** (D23) represented Tufts at the meeting. **Andy Cheung** (D21) received the 2021 AADR Bloc Travel Grant Award, for the scientific excellence of his research abstract. **Dr. Mariam Margvelashvili-Malament**, Assistant Professor in the Department of Prosthodontics, won the Neal Garrett Award which recognizes clinically focused and patient centered original research. **Katie Dunn**, Assistant Director of Predoctoral Research, was selected for a second term as secretary/treasurer for the Student Training and Research (STAR) Network.
