MOTIVATE PD: Developing a Client-Centered Social Self-Management Program for People with Parkinson's Disease

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Introduction

- Parkinson's Disease (PD) is a progressive, neurological condition that affects over 10 million people worldwide¹
- Current rehabilitation programs for people with Parkinson's disease
 (PwPD) focus primarily on motor symptom remediation^{2,3,4}
- The Tufts Health Quality of Life (HQoL) Lab, under direction of Linda Tickle-Degnen, identified a lack of PD-specific programs that address biopsychosocial health through what they define as social selfmanagement (SocM)^{5,6}
- SocM = Self-care practices in which one engages one's social resources to manage healthful daily living
- SocM behaviors associated with higher quality of life (QoL)^{5,6}:







2 rounds

Occupational therapy practitioners (OTPs) believe in the **value of participation in meaningful activities;** OTPs can support clients in establishing, restoring, & maintaining social self-management techniques to support long-term health & overall QoL^{7,8}

Aims + Methods

Purpose: Develop an OT-based *social self-management manual* for PwPD that is client-centered, addresses biopsychosocial health, & supports long-term motivation & goal-directed behavior

Aim #1: Create Manual

- ✓ Literature Review
- ✓ Analyze interview transcripts from the HQOL SocM lab database⁹
- ✓ Review PD case studies^{10,11}
- ✓ Design 1st draft in Canva

Aim #2: Delphi Method*

Delphi Method: a process by which an interdisciplinary panel of experts provides feedback on a relevant issue, responses are analyzed & interpreted, & process is repeated for 2+ rounds.

- ✓ Recruit expert panelists (n=8)
- ✓ Create Qualtrics surveys to gather feedback
- ✓ Send materials to experts via e-mail
- ✓ Analyze quantitative & qualitative responses
- ✓ Apply revisions to manual

Aim #3: Disseminate Manual

- ✓ Create flyer with QR code to access web-based manual
- ✓ Distribute flyers at April 2024 Tufts Dance for Parkinson's event
- ✓ E-mail flyers to clinicians in local PD community

Results

Accessibility

• 3/8 discussed concerns re: computer literacy

• 3/8 identified areas of jargon

Representation

- 2/8 said biased towards those who are retired/ have discretionary income
- 2/8 requested more opportunities for those who do not have care partners or family




Sample Survey Responses

Round 1 (Top Line) vs. Round 2 (Bottom Line)


"Please indicate whether you agree or disagree with the following statements..."




This resource presents information in multiple ways to support understanding.

Manual Strengths

Simple design

Accessibility features

- Jimpic acsign
- Approachable length
- No medical jargon
- Compatible with PDF screen-readers
- Audiobook option

• Fills multiple gaps in practice

- OT-specific
- Client-centered
- Emphasis on activities & social participation
- Holistic approach to health
- Supports long-term problem-solving & goal-setting
- Supports independence, self-efficacy, and autonomy

Manual Limitations

- Language accessibility: Currently available in English only
- Computer accessibility: Currently available online only
- Requires computer, phone, or tablet to access
- Requires moderate level of computer literacy
- Region-specific: Most resources pertain to New England area
- Intended for *community-dwelling PwPD*; less applicable to those with higher physical and cognitive needs

Conclusions

Motivate PD has been *evaluated & endorsed* by an interdisciplinary panel of experts in the Parkinson's community; *it is ready for piloting* to determine its effectiveness in supporting PwPD & care partners over time

Future Directions

- Pilot manual: Obtain feedback from PwPD & care partners via survey or focus group regarding:
 - Helpfulness
 - Usability
 - Whether supports goal-setting & motivation
 - Whether promotes biopsychosocial health

Expand access:

- Translate manual into other languages
- Get funding to print materials in hard-copy
- Create Motivate PD website
- Consolidate into pamphlet for doctor's offices

Expand audience:

- Differentiate based on stage of PD
- Adapt for non-community dwelling PwPD
- Adapt for region-specific resources outside of New England or worldwide
