INTRODUCTION

Adaptive swimming lessons increase the accessibility of this sport and life-saving leisure activity for children of all abilities.

Benefits:

- Children with cerebral palsy (CP) improved their gross motor function and swimming skills through an adaptive swim program.¹
- Children with CP, paresis, and spina bifida improved their balance and swimming movements through an adaptive swim program.²
 Children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) improved their swimming
- and safety skills with behavioral supports, equipment aids, modeling, and decreasing physical assistance through an adaptive swim program.³
- Online training is an effective instructional format⁴ that increases accessibility, flexibility, affordability, interactivity, collaboration, and reach.⁵

Current Limitations:

- Individuals with disabilities participate less frequently in recreational physical activity due to barriers to awareness, accessibility, financial costs, transportation, and physical and cognitive impairments.⁶
- Existing swimming guidelines focus on water safety skills⁷⁻¹⁰ yet lack universal guidelines for adaptive swimming instruction.





RECOMMENDATIONS

To enhance The Sunfish Method©:

Expand on...

- Group lessons
- Common fears of swimmers (e.g. fear of water, being cold, not being able to breathe while in water)
- Parent/caregiver involvement
- Techniques to support individuals with specific physical, visual, and hearing impairments

Include...

Videos of real-world lessons using learned techniques

Study Strengths:

- Increased accessibility of adaptive swimming trainings
- Demonstrated the value of occupational therapy in adaptive swimming
- Provides direction to enhance The Sunfish Method[©] for its target population

Study Limitations:

- Small number of survey responses
- Randomized survey options may have introduced order bias
- Limited feedback opportunities on the application of The Sunfish Method[©] to real-world lessons

Future Considerations:

- Conduct additional focus groups with community-based aquatic organizations to gather feedback from adaptive swimming instructors
- Continue dissemination through community-based aquatic organizations, conferences, and parent/caregiver support groups for children with disabilities

CONCLUSION

The Sunfish Method[©] provides instructors with skills to teach adaptive swimming lessons to children of all abilities, with opportunities to enhance its impact by incorporating additional adaptive techniques.
