



Recommendation Report for CBTF to Support Implementing SPAN Programming: Quick Guide

#1: Minimal Modification to SPAN programming

- Majority of survey participants report “somewhat likely” to participate as SPAN volunteer coach and reported SPAN time commitment requirements were “just right”

#2: Emphasize SPAN’s unique opportunity to volunteer virtually

- Biggest reported barriers to volunteering (too much time & far location) are strongest motivators for participating as SPAN volunteer coach

#3: Highlight training/ongoing support SPAN volunteers receive

- Increases volunteer interest in organization and confidence in coaching abilities/working with brain tumor survivor population

#4: Recruit from student population

- Specifically target students interested in healthcare majors and/or childhood development careers/degrees
- Attend university volunteer fairs, contact administrators of relevant university departments, or post on university volunteer portals

#5: Invite CBTF community members to attend recruitment events & share experiences

- Provides volunteers with clearer expectations of responsibilities & chance to meet new people (a motivating factor of volunteering)

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
