

## Doctoral fellowship for a student specializing in the politics of Ukraine/Eastern Europe

Department of Political Science at Baylor University invites applications from students interested in pursuing doctoral research on the politics of contemporary Ukraine and Eastern Europe starting August, 2025.

The Department is particularly interested in students whose research interests intersect comparative politics and international relations subfields and address such topics as civil society, political institutions and regional and international security in the context of Russian-Ukrainian war.

The successful applicant will receive a 5-year scholarship (4 years if they already received an MA degree) for up to \$30,000 per year as part of the teaching apprenticeship, a full tuition remission, a health insurance subsidy and an opportunity to work with the faculty with expertise in the region at Baylor and partner universities.

The applicants need to have at least a Bachelor's degree in political science or related field, but students with Master's degree and established record of research are particularly encouraged to apply. Additional application requirements include GRE examination results, three letters of recommendation, a statement of purpose and a writing sample.
