Comments

Textbook is outstanding; it is clear, follows a logical flow of information, and uses interesting real—world examples to illustrate its points. It was somewhat onerous to have to comment on the textbook every week. I wonder if the requirement could be relaxed to comment 5 or 6 times throughout the semester rather than weekly.

This course was a lot of reading and busy work within the textbook.

The assigned readings were helpful and reiterated the information in the lectures. They were long! I didn't love the weekly annotation, but I understand the value for students, the professor, and the author.

The few hours we spent in residency reviewing and drawing all the analytic diagrams together was invaluable! This should definitely be preserved if possible. I thought it was very helpful to do this in person and in real time so that we could discuss and answer questions, so if possible I suggest having an in–person option for anyone taking the class locally along with a synchronous Zoom session.

13. Name at least one thing that should be improved about this course:

Comments

The course project and the weekly exercises (drawing analytic diagrams and data analysis) were very effective in terms of learning the material and learning how to apply it, but searching for news articles that could be applied to each specific topic took a long time. I wonder if the news article section could be reduced to finding 1 article each week instead of 2, or having a pre—existing set of news articles to choose from for some of the topics. The data analysis exercises were very time consuming but I felt that every piece of those was useful for learning and should be kept in their current format even though they are time consuming.

Creating graphs from data downloaded to Excel was an important part of this course. It would be great if there was a tutorial offered that would prepare students for this.

Not assuming that everyone has taken an economics class.

I think a flipped format would be far more beneficial (for me). Spending time in class with Will to work on drawing the analytical framework visuals would have helped so much. Trying to find an article that I understood and then trying to apply it to the concepts each week was taxing and, in some cases, led to a feeling of defeat. I spent 6+ hours just on the assignment each week. That left very little time to chip away at the final project, which I spent at least 50 hours on over a weekend. I enjoyed the class it was just a lot!


The workload in terms of the weekly exercises was quite high. It generally took me 2–3 hours to complete the written assignments each week; then having to also comment on the textbook and write a discussion post each week was quite a bit of work. I would suggest considering reducing the amount of times students have to comment on the textbook and having some other forum for discussion (perhaps 2–3 times total in the semester when the class meet synchronously for a live discussion) rather than the weekly discussion posts.

This class was extremely challenging for someone who has never taken an economics class prior


