Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Clinic Guidelines

- 1. OMFS appointments can be booked at the 5th floor front desk effective immediately
 - a. Please bring up all the pertinent information including the patient Axium number (not their name due to HIPAA issues)
 - b. Please review the OMS survival guide for all the information needed to make an appointment
 - c. You may still use the emailing option, but try to come up to the 5th floor
 - d. We will only allow 3 students at the front desk at one time. So if you see 3 students already, please come back later

2. OMFS clinic update

- e. You are required to have gone through an Emergency Rotation or be accompanied by a student (either 3rd or 4th year) who has gone through an Emergency rotation if you have not had a rotation yet.
- f. You must review the information on the OMS survival guide on Canvas. If you do not know which forms to fill out, you may be dismissed from the clinic (Yes, your patient will not be treated that day, and Yes, they will be angry because you wasted their time.)
- g. We are still at 50% capacity and we are able to give appointments to around 4 students per session
- h. You may help your classmate in a procedure, two students are allowed in an operatory at a time
- i. Students are encouraged to share procedures in the clinic when appropriate. All procedures done on the 5th floor can count towards the requirement.
- i. New white Board
- 1. There's a new white board that is put up across from the resident's room
- 2. Before starting the procedure, please write your operatory, name, and procedure you're performing (extractions of teeth #s x, consult, etc.)
 - a. When you need help, need a consult, or need a resident/attending to swipe a note, put a check mark in the "need assistance" column
- 1. The residents and attending will check the board intermittently and come help you if you need any assistance
- 2. OMFS requirements: Currently, we are adjusting the D22 requirements minimally.
 - a. Extraction/head and neck cancer risk screening MPEs (MO7140): 10 MPEs (this does not include the extraction competencies which is 2 additional teeth)
 - b. Extraction/head and neck cancer risk screening competency (CO7140) two is required. Again, separate from the MPE's
 - c. Local anesthesia competencies (COLAMX and COLAMN):
- 1. You are required to do one maxillary and one mandibular LA as a competency
- 2. This can be combined with an extraction MPE or CE
 - a. Suture practical: Will now be on a banana
- 1. You are required to placed 3 types of sutures: a simple interrupted, figure 8, and a continuous suture (either a baseball stitch or a continuous interlocking)

- 2. Suturing kits can be checked out on the 5th floor dispensary, you may use the 5th floor conference room if it's not occupied
 - a. Please take a short video of one of the sutures (up to you which one you would like to video) and send it to me
- 1. Take a picture of the other 2 sutures
- 2. A video example will be uploaded onto canvas
- 3. If you have done the suturing workshop on a mask prior to the COVID shutdown and it's graded, you will not have to redo this practical
 - a. Suturing competency (CO7SUT): Should be done on a patient and graded on Axium
 - b. Flap competency (CO7FLP): This is required for D22 at this time
 - c. Written exam will be given on Canvas on March of 2022. Students are not allowed to take it early.
 - d. Sedation workshop: a video and a quiz will be posted March of 2022. Students are not allowed to take it early
 - e. Oral exam is cancelled.
