


# You can help pollinators by growing **native plants!**

### REMEMBER, choose plants that:

1. Are native (NOT native cultivars)
2. Differ in bloom time
3. Vary in color, height, shape
4. Are not treated with systemic pesticides
5. Support pollinators throughout their lifecycle
