Bees

European honey bee (Apis mellifera)

Common eastern bumble bee (Bombus impatiens)
Brown-belted bumble bee (Bombus griseocollis)

Large carpenter bee (*Xylocopa virginica*)

 Distinguish from bumble bees by polished black abdomen and dark-mustard thorax with a perfectly round black spot in the middle

Small carpenter bee (*Ceratina* sp.)

Sunflower longhorn bee (Melissodes trinodis)

- males with very long antennae, males sleep on flowers at night
- females with thick brushes of hair on hind legs
- closely associated with sunflowers Helianthus

Hostile leaf-cutter bee (*Megachile inimica*)

• actually very gentle, likes yellow asters, stores pollen beneath abdomen

Ligated furrow bee (Halictus ligatus)

Squash bee (*Peponapis pruinosa*)

specialist of squash plants, males sleep in flowers

Broad-footed cellophane bee (Colletes latitarsis)

specialist of tomatillo plants, listen for the buzz pollinating!

Two-spotted longhorn bee (Melissodes bimaculatus)

• all black, likes collecting pollen from squash and corn flowers

Striped-sweat bee (*Agapostemon* sp.)

Sweat bee (Lasioglossum sp.)

European wool-carder bee (Anthidium manicatum)

 seen with a few people after the safari, males patrol territories of mint/ sage/lavender flowers

Lunate longhorn cuckoo bee (*Triepeolus lunatus*)

seen with a few people after the safari, lays eggs in longhorn bee nests

Leaf-cutter bee (Megachile sp.) *likely M. latimanus, on lavender

Butterflies/Moths

Cabbage white (Pieris rapae)
Peck's skipper (Polites peckius)

Wasps

European paper wasp (*Polistes dominula*) **Bald-faced hornet** (*Dolichovespula maculata*)

• social, builds the big basketball sized papery nests in trees **Hump-backed bee wolf** (*Philanthus gibbosus*)

- solitary, hunts sweat bees, indicates a very healthy bee population **Mexican grass-carrying wasp** (*Isodontia mexicana*)
 - solitary, hunts crickets, 2 generations per year in MA

Yellow-legged mud-dauber wasp (Sceliphron caementarium)

• solitary, *very* skinny waist, hunts spiders, builds nests out of wet mud

Hover Flies

Margined calligrapher (Toxomerus marginatus)
Thick-legged fly (Syritta pipiens)

Other Flies

Common green bottle fly (Lucilia sericata)
Root-maggot fly (Anthomyiidae)

Beetles

Red milkweed beetle (Tetraopes tetrophthalmus) Spotted pink ladybeetle (Coleomegilla maculata)
