As states, international organizations, and NGOs respond to this complex crisis, it is more crucial than ever to engage in meaningful, multi-sectoral analysis that promotes action.

The PRAXIS editorial team is seeking research, opinion, and review pieces to enrich collective understanding of the root causes, patterns, impacts, and responses to migration from economic, social, historical, political, and legal perspectives.

Topics may include but are not limited to:

- Migration resulting from violence and conflict
- Gendered dimensions of migration
- Economic motivations for migration
- State and NGO responses to migration
- Short- and long-term migrant resettlement
- Legal classification of migrants, refugees, asylum seekers, and IDPs
- The migrant journey
- Realities of statelessness
- Case studies

- Reviews and Opinion pieces should be between 3 5 double-spaced pages.
- Please include a one paragraph abstract with each piece.
- Citations should be in endnote format in accordance with the Chicago Manual of Style.
