# Pre-college Philosophy lesson 6 - Crime and Punishment Maddy, Addison, Sam

**Goals:** Discuss different philosophies of punishment, retributive vs restorative. Discuss the societal goals of punishment. Question the nature of punishment.

Intro: Names and one example of crime that they feel deserves a "minor" punishment.

# First Activity: Why We Punish/Means of punishment

- Have students write down what they believe the main reason that we punish
  - Go around the room and each student says what they wrote
  - Discuss similarities and differences between their views of punishment
- Think about severity of crimes and corresponding severity of punishments
  - How should we take into account societal factors when discussing punishment?
- Defining a few terms with them (maybe they will get there on their own, but we should definitely make sure that they know the differences between these two forms of justice)
  - Retributive justice focuses on punishment as a primary means of restoring justice
  - Restorative justice focuses on reaffirming shared values and learning from mistakes as a means of restoring justice

# Second Activity: Heinz Problem

- Heinz Problem
  - Should Heinz steal the medicine that saves his wife? Should he be punished? How should he be punished?
  - What would happen if he did/did not steal the medicine? Compare and contrast
    - Is punishment consequentialist by nature? Is there something more to punishment than the possible outcomes?
  - What is the severity of the punishment that would be "right" for this action (taking into account all potential actions he might take)?
- What types of actions deserve punishment?
  - How should we hold people accountable for their actions, is retributive or restorative justice better?
- Is punishment necessary?
  - Is Retributive punishment good?
  - Is Restorative punishment good?
  - Either more good than the other?

- Is punishment an example of care?
- Do all immoral actions deserve punishment?
- Is there a moral aspect to punishment?

#### Third Activity: Superheroes (if needed)

- Are superheroes the ultimate purveyor of good/moral actions?
- Should superheroes be punished for damaging large metropolitan areas?
- Do they escape punishment?

- Is punishment necessary?
