10/24 Class Plan

Goals: Introduce an epistemological framework of thought to the children. Re-introduce big questions about certainty and how we use our senses and critical thought to realize the "truth."

Intro: (5 minutes)

Review of Philosophy

- Do you remember big questions?
- One big question and one question
 - What is something you know?
 - What makes something real?
 - Have you ever believed something that wasn't real? How did you find out? What did you think about this change?

- Sight (7 minutes)
 - Optical Illusions
- Touch (7 minutes)
 - Have a couple of objects in a bag, and have them reach in and touch it
 - They feel a stuffed cat in a paper bag; what do they guess?
 - - How do they know that that is what it is?
 - Notice how people have different guesses.
- Smell (7 minutes)
 - Bring in some stuff for them to smell
 - Coffee
 - Orange peel
 - Empty bag with perfume
 - Cinnamon stick
 - Discuss what we think we are smelling and how, or do we, know and trust what they are?

- How did you feel about this activity?
- Can you be sure about what you know?
- Do you still think
