
Weekly Showcase

"The linga is a pillar symbol emblematic of Lord Shiva. On this linga, this form is phallic, and Lord Shiva's head is adorned on its face reflecting inherited design conventions from 6th and 7th century Gupta India. Hindu religious-cultural symbols are often sculped in white marble, like shown here."

English translation Insistency, ingenuity, and indomitability of heart are required for achieving results. Therefore I say so!




