

Dr. Cynthia Krug, Reading/Psychoeducational Clinician



Dr. Cynthia Krug received her Ph.D. from the Eliot-Pearson Department of Child Development at Tufts University in 1996, where she focused on reading, elementary education, and psychoeducational assessment. She holds a Massachusetts teacher's license, certification in Orton-Gilligham and extensive training in Lindamood-Bell and the RAVE-O fluency program designed and researched by Professor Maryanne Wolf and her colleagues.

In 1998, Dr. Krug was hired to design and direct the Tufts Literacy Corps (TLC), a training and supervisory program for Tufts students who tutor children enrolled in local schools. Under her direction, the TLC has grown to six times its original size. It now includes 65 to 85 members each year, who staff three core tutoring groups (reading, writing and mathematics) and several student-led initiatives. In the summer of 2010, Dr. Krug launched **Literacy & the Arts**, a summer program that integrates one-on-one tutoring with art, drama and a fun full day of summer care.

Dr. Krug runs a private practice in Medford, Massachusetts. Her educational work with children takes a diagnostic teaching approach that integrates tutoring and assessment, so that the tutoring addresses each child's unique needs and learning style.
